British-Cypriot author N.E. McMorran releases final standalone book in the award-winning children's sci-fi adventure series 'MOOJAG'.

The book uses the sloth as a powerful allegory, presenting 'slowness as a survival strategy' — that brilliantly reframes different ways of processing and reacting as strengths, and affirms that different is good.
